



CAN WE SEE AN EXAMPLE QUESTION?

Find the Answer Board labelled “Example”.

This shows how each Answer Board contains 16 different answers.

Each answer has been assigned a letter from A to P.

These are the four questions which need answering by matching to the correct answers on the Answer Board.

ARE THERE ANY EASIER QUESTIONS?

The questions have been split into three sets.

One set that contains slightly more straightforward questions which might suit younger players: “Beginner” - with a “B” before the question number.

Another set are possibly more difficult: “Expert” - with an “E” before their number.

The remaining questions are labelled “Popular” and have each question number preceded by a “P”.

The Host has already decided which set/sets you will be playing with. If desired, the order in which you tackle the questions can be changed throughout the game.

HOW DOES THE GAME END?

This is up to you - either when all of the prepared Question Cards have been used, or when everyone has decided it really is time to continue with the seder, or when no one is talking to one another because there have been too many arguments over who the first team was to complete a round.

The team with the highest number of points is the winner.
